It is essential that all staff receive e-safety training and understand their responsibilities, as outlined in this policy. Training will be offered as follows:

A planned programme of formal e-safety training will be made available to staff.

All new staff should receive e-safety training as part of their induction programme, ensuring that they fully understand the school e-safety policy and Acceptable Use Policies

6. Technical infrastructure / equipment, filtering and monitoring

The school will be responsible for ensuring that the school infrastructure / network is as safe and secure as is reasonably possible and that policies and procedures approved within this policy are implemented. It will also need to ensure that the relevant people named in the above sections will be effective in carrying out their e-safety responsibilities:

School ICT systems will be managed in ways that ensure that the school meets the esafety technical requirements outlined in the SWGfL Security Policy and Acceptable Usage Policy

There will be regular reviews and audits of the safety and security of school ICT systems

Servers, wireless systems and cabling must be securely located and physical access restricted

All users will have clearly defined access rights to school ICT systems.

All users will be provided with a username and password, which they must not divulge to anyone.

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Students must not take, use, share, publish or distribute images of others without their permission

Photographs published on the website, or elsewhere that include students will be selected carefully and will comply with good practice guidance on the use of such images.

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
